## Masterworks Programming

Featuring symphonic repertoire from celebrated masters, like Mozart and Beethoven, as well as diverse contemporary composers like Michael Abels and Joan Tower, this series is offered six weekends a year, and includes Saturday evening performances in the Adler Theatre and Sunday afternoon at Centennial Hall on the campus of Augustana. More than 1,200 season subscribers comprise the majority of our weekend attendees, with hundreds more single ticket purchasers per concert. The 108th season promises plenty of exciting performances with the theme The Triumphant Spirit, highlighting the extraordinary talent within our orchestra. Featured performers include, Jonathan Baily Holland's minimalist and hip-hop influenced response to Ludwig van Beethoven and his 9th Symphony through a 21st century lens and Virtuoso violinist Bella Hristova returns to the Quad Cities with Dmitri Shostakovich's boisterous and darkly comedic Violin Concerto No. 1.

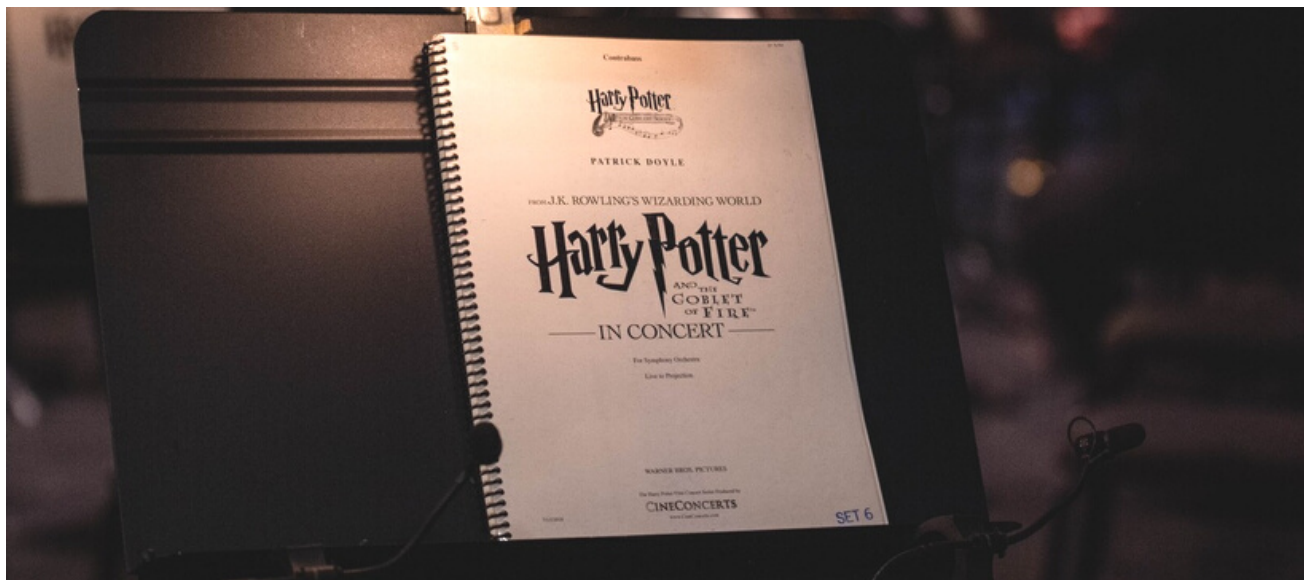

## Education Programs

SYMPHONY DAY  
MARCH 2, 2023

Held each spring, Symphony Day is the largest single-day music education program available in the Quad Cities. An extensive classroom curriculum, including a teacher's guide, classroom materials, and music selections, is offered online at no charge to teachers to more than 200 area schools. Instructors use the curriculum materials prior to the concert to provide students with an introduction to classical music, composers, history, musical instruments, and more. After completion of the classroom instruction, 6,000 students attend one of three free classical music concerts performed by Quad City Symphony Orchestra musicians.

## Education Programs

### STUDENTS @ SYMPHONY

The QCSO also broadens our access to many underserved students through our Students @ Symphony program. This program brings, on average, 250 students and their families to each Masterworks performance for free with their school music teachers for a shared experience of musical inspiration. We have expanded on these programs to create more access to our Masterworks performances through our new Concert Access Pass (CAP). Similar to the Oakland Symphony Hall Pass, we collaborate with social service agencies to make free tickets available to low-income individuals receiving state financial aid. CAP broadens access outside of students to give ANY individual the ability to engage with the QCSO, no matter their financial circumstances.

## Education Programs

### GROUP LESSON PROGRAM

The QCSO Group Lesson Program (GLP) for cello students was initiated in 2017-18. It is a music instrument lesson program implemented in partnership with the Boys and Girls Clubs of the Mississippi Valley (BGMV). QCSO cellist Elisabeth Oar teaches Suzuki Method instruction, which emphasizes familiarity and basic competency prior to music literacy, among other techniques, to approximately 20 second-through fourth-grade students at the Moline and Davenport clubs as part of their after-school programs. The students receive twice weekly, free group lessons on their own size-appropriate cello provided for them to use in the program. Through various times in the year, the students have the opportunity to perform what they have learned for their families and other club members, and at the end of the season, present a group recital. In 2021-22, the QCSO expanded the GLP to include violin instruction at the BGMV and at two new sites in Rock Island. The QCSO is partnering with Spring Forward, the Rock Island School District after-school program, to provide the GLP at Thomas Jefferson Elementary.
