

Helpful Hints for Fundraising

- 1. Create a list: The main reason people don't give money is that no one asks them! So be thorough and think of as many people as you can to solicit. Remember: the more people you ask, the better your chances of success!
- 2. Be creative: Spread the message about your fundraising efforts through any means possible Facebook, Twitter, YouTube, a blog, a fundraising website, or a good old-fashioned letter! Include a personal message describing the tour and your need to raise funds for it.
- 3. *Make it easy*: With each letter or email, include contribution forms that include a deadline of April 1, 2025. And include a stamped envelope or a link to your fundraising website.
- 4. Be specific: Donors tend to give more when asked to give a specific amount.
- 5. Be confident: Keep in mind, always, that you are not "begging for money" you are seeking support for a major educational and cultural opportunity with your youth orchestra. Ask with confidence!
- 6. Follow-up: If you haven't received a response from someone you've asked for a donation, be sure to follow up. Make a phone call or send a quick email to make sure that they haven't forgotten.
- 7. Be organized: For any forms you receive, collect the contribution forms and staple them together. IF CHECKS ARE MADE OUT TO QCSO, MAKE SURE THAT YOUR **FULL NAME AND "TOUR"** ARE IN THE MEMO LINE OF EACH CHECK, AND MAKE SURE YOUR NAME IS ON EACH CONTRIBUTION FORM YOU SEND IN. Turn in the forms or mail to the QCSO. Please do not bring payments to QCSO rehearsals as they will not be secure.
- 8. Say thanks! Once you have received a contribution from someone, let the individual know that the contribution—whatever the amount—is important to you. You can also invite your donors to QCSYE concerts so that they can hear the results of your hard work in person. It is a good idea to send a personal thank you to show how very much you appreciate the support!

Cancellation Policy For Concert + Companion Tours

The QCSO Association recommends that concert and companion tour members purchase travel insurance after they commit to participating in any QCSYE international tour. The QCSO recommends the travel insurance and global assistance options offered by Travel Guard, but students/companions may choose travel insurance from any provider.

The initial deposit which secures a companion/student's spot on the tour is non-refundable under any circumstance that causes a companion/student to cancel participation.

In the case a companion/student cancels his/her participation on or before December 1, 2024, up to 100% of the tour payments processed on behalf of said student are eligible for a refund with the exception of the deposit. Each instance of companion/student cancellation is evaluated on a case-by-case basis to determine the exact percentage of refund that can be offered by the QCSYE.

In the case a student cancels his/her participation between December 2, 2024 - March 1, 2025, up to 50% of the tour payments processed on behalf of said companion/student are eligible for a refund with the exception of the deposit. Each instance of companion/student cancellation is evaluated on a case-by-case basis to determine the exact percentage of refund that can be offered by the QCSYE.

In the case a companion/student cancels his/her participation on or after March 2, 2025, up to 0% of the tour payments processed on behalf of said student are eligible for a refund with the exception of the deposit. Each instance of student cancellation is evaluated on a case-by-case basis to determine the exact percentage of refund that can be offered by the QCSYE.

In the case that QCSYE cancels the tour for any reason, 100% of all processed companion/student tour payments including the deposit will be refunded.
